Trees (including shade trees, ornamental trees and evergreen trees)

Arborvitae (Thuja) - several varieties of eastern (T. occidentalis) and western (T. plicata).

Baldcypress (Taxodium distichum)

Beech (Fagus) - both American (F. grandifolia) and cultivars of European (F. sylvatica)

Birch (Betula) - River (B. nigra), Paper (B. papyrifera) and Whitespire (B. platyphylla)

Buckeye (Aesculus) - Ohio (A. glabra) and Yellow (A. flava)

Cherry (Prunus) - Pink and white flowering weeping trees

Crabapple (Malus) - Many different shapes, sizes and bloom colors.

Dawn Redwood (Metasequoia glyptostroboides)

Dogwood (Cornus) - several cultivars of two species and of the cross between the two; Chinese (C. kousa), Common (C. florida) and the Stellar Series hybrids Chinese (C. kousa), Common (C. florida) and the Stellar Series hybrids

Gingko (Ginkgo biloba)

Hemlock (Tsuga) - both the eastern species (T. Canadensis) and weeping.

Hickory - Shagbark (Carya ovata)

Hophornbeam (Ostrya virginiana)

Hornbeam (Carpinus) - both American (C. caroliniana) and varieties of European (C. betulus)

Horsechestnut (Aesculus) - White (A. hippocastanum 'Baumannii' and Red (A. x carnea)

Katsuratree (Cercidiphyllum japonicum)

Lilac (Syringa) - Ivory Silk and meyeri bush grafted on standard

Linden - American (Tilia Americana)

Magnolia (Magnolia) - Cucumber (M. acuminate) and Sweetbay (M. virginiana)

Maple (Acer) - a huge selection, including many culitvars of each, Fullmoon (A. shirasawanum), Japanese (A. palmatum), Norway (A. platanoides), Red (A. rubrum), State Street (A. miyabei) and last but far from least, Sugar (A. saccharum)

Oak (Quercus) - Bur (Q. macrocarpa), Chinkapin (Q. muehlenbergii), Red (Q. rubra), Shingle (Q. imbricaria), Swamp White (Q. bicolor) and White (Q. alba)

Pear - Callery (Pyrus calleryana) - several cultivars

Pine - Eastern White (Pinus strobus)

Plum - Mt. St. Helen's (Prunus cerasifera 'Mt. St. Helen's')

Redbud - Eastern (Cercis canadensis) - several cultivars

Serviceberry (Amelanchier) - several cultivars.

Spruce (Picea) - including many sizes of Colorado Blue (P. pungens), Norway (P. abies), White (P. glauca), Black Hills (P. glauca 'Densata'), and Weeping White (P. glauca 'Pendula').

Sweetgum (Liquidambar styraciflua)

Sycamore - Planetree (Platanus acerifolia)

Tuliptree - (Liriodendron tulipifera)

Yellowwood (Cladrastis kentukea)

Shrubs & Vines

Arborvitae (Thuja)

Barberry (Berberis) 'Concorde' & 'Crimson Pygmy'

Boxwood (Buxus) - several varieties of globe and pyramidal

Buckeye - Bottlebrush (Aesculus parviflora)

Burning Bush (Euonymus alatus)

Butterfly Bush (Buddleia)

Cotoneaster - Cranberry (Cotoneaster apiculatus)

Cypress (Chamaecyparis pisifera 'Filifera')

Elderberry - Black Lace (Sambucus nigra 'Eva')

Euonymus (Euonymus fortunei) - many variegated colors, sizes and shapes.

Forsythia (Forsythia)

Hydrangea (Hydrangea) - some grow to large size, some stay small and one climbs. Blooms range from green to white to pink.

Juniper (Juniperus) - from 6 inch tall wide spreading groundcovers to 15 ft. tall narrow columns

Lilac (Syringa) may varieties, sizes and bloom colors

Magnolia (Magnolia) - narrow upright to wide spreading multi-trunk shrubs.

Plum - Cistena (Prunus x cistena)

Rose - Knockout (Rosa x 'Radtko')

Serviceberry (Amelanchier)

Smoke Bush (Cotinus coggygria)

Spirea (Spiraea) - 2-3 ft. tall varieties to 6-8 ft. tall; several bloom colors.

Spruce (Picea) - ranging from low growing spreaders, to globe shaped and pyramidal

Viburnum (Viburnum) - many sizes and shapes

Weigela - Wine & Roses (Weigela florida 'Wine & Roses')

Witchhazel - vernal (Hamamelis vernalis)

Yew (Taxus) - Many varieties from low mounding, globe, upright and pyramidal

Perennials, Ferns, Grasses & Groundcovers

Of all plant materials, availability of perennials is the most variable. This is a much shortened list of what may be available.

Astilbe (Astilbe) - white, pink and red blooming varieties

Black Eyed Susan (Rudbeckia fulgida 'Goldstrum')

Clematis (Clematis) - many varieties and bloom colors

Coneflower - Purple (Echinacea)

Coralbell (Heuchera) - green leaf to purple leaf, some variegated; blooms red to white

Daylily - Stella de Oro (Hemerocallis 'Stella de Oro').

Dianthus - Firewitch Pinks (Dianthus gratianopolitanus 'Firewitch')

Feather Reed Grass (Calamagrostis acutiflora 'Karl Foerster')

Fern - Cinnamon (Osmundastrum cinnamomeum)

Fern - Ostrich (Matteuccia struthiopteris)

Fountain Grass - Dwarf (Pennisetum alopecuroides 'Hameln')

Hosta - We stock at least 10 different varieties of Hostas. Availability varies each year.

Liriope (Liriope muscari) - solid green or variegated; aka Monkey Grass

Maiden Grass (Miscanthus sinensis) - many shapes, blade widths and colors

Pachysandra (Pachysandra)

Sedum - Autumn Joy (Sedum'Autumn Joy')

Solomon's Seal - Variegated (Polygonatum odoratum Variegatum)

Switchgrass (Panicum) - red, blue and gray

Zebra Grass (Miscanthus sinensis zebrinus)

Vegetables, Herbs & Fruits

We grow organically! Our selection of herbs and vegetables changes slightly each year, but here's a list of vegetable starts we should have in the early spring: broccoli, red & green cabbage, kale, several varieties of lettuce and onion plants.

Later in the season, our selection may include celery, cucumbers, eggplant, ground cherries, melons, lots of peppers, pumpkin, squash, tomatillos, several varieties of tomatoes and watermelon. For herbs, we hope to have several types of basil, including globe and Sweet Genovese, chives, cilantro, dill, oregano, parsley (plain leaf and curled), sage, rosemary, and thyme.

We also offer organically grown seed potatoes in several varieties.
