Hardy plants will produce sweet yellow onions that can potentially be 6" wide. Candy onion plants are easy to grow due to their strong root system and disease resistance. They're great eaten raw, on sandwiches, lightly cooked in salsas and stir-fries, and cooked into meat dishes, casseroles and other recipes. It's also a fairly good storage variety. Day-neutral onions, like Candy Hybrid, begin forming bulbs when daylight lasts 12-14 hours, making them well adapted to Ohio.

PATTERSON ONION
